Standards of Conduct, Enforcement and Sanctions

Central Alabama Community College is a public educational institution of the State of Alabama and, as such, shall not allow on its premises or at any activity it sponsors the possession, use, or distribution of any alcoholic beverage or any illicit drug by any student, employee, or visitor. If such prohibited possession, use, or distribution by a student or employee is confirmed, Central Alabama Community College shall, within the scope of applicable federal and state due process requirements, take such administrative or disciplinary
